Abstract of Thesis

The thesis aims to shed light on the political relations between Nazi Germany and Japan between 1933 and 1941. The thesis consisted of an introduction, five chapters and a conclusion.

The first chapter deals with German-Japanese relations since the establishment of the German Empire in 1871 until the Nazis came to power in 1933. The second chapter examined the political relations between the two sides since the Nazis came to power at the beginning of 1933 and until the conclusion of the Anti-Communism Alliance in 1936, Highlighted the intellectual and political factors that led the two countries towards political rapprochement, leading to the alliance against communism and the nature of that alliance and its consequences. Chapter III deals with the implications of the Japanese-Chinese war on the relationship between Germany and Japan (1937-1938). Chapter four deals with the German-German dispute between the struggle against communism and the anti-Western forces of 1938-1940. The fifth chapter deals with German-Japanese political relations within the framework of the Tripartite Alliance Charter 1940-1941, the influence of the Japanese-Soviet neutrality agreement and the German invasion of Soviet lands In the German-Japanese relations of October 1940- June 1941, as well as the German position on the Japanese-US negotiations and the Japanese military attack on Pearl Harbor in December 1941.
